Ipswich plaque with salt box house at top. This style with antique lettering is used by default for houses built before 1820 (First Period, Georgian and Federal style houses). See the Benjamin Grant house plaque above.



Ipswich plaque with flat top (no salt box). This style with modern lettering is used by default for houses built after 1820. (Greek Revival, Italianate, Victorian and later houses). See the James Scott house plaque on the right.
