LUNT, Trustees of THE IPSWICH HERITAGE TRUST under Declaration of Trust dated February 7, 1964, recorded with Essex South District Deeds Book 5171, Page 621, as amended, acting herein by virtue and in execution of the power and authority to them given in and by said Declaration of Trust, and every other power them hereto enabling, FOR CONSIDERATION PAID GRANT to DAVID J. LANE and PAUL W. SCHROETER, both of Essex, Essex County, Massachusetts, as tenants in common, an undivided one-half interest each, the land in Ipswich, Essex County, Massachusetts, situated at the northerly corner of Central and North Main Streets, with the buildings and other improvements thereon, including the historic landmark known as the Colonel Appleton House, bounded and described as follows:

SOUTHEASTERLY by North Main Street, one hundred ten and 26/100 feet;

SOUTHWESTERLY by Central Street, one hundred thirty-nine and 39/100 feet;

NORTHWESTERLY by land of Inhabitants of the Town of Ipswich, along fences about one hundred thirty-six feet; and by land now or formerly of heirs of Charles W. Brown, one hundred fourteen and 27/100 feet.

Or however otherwise said parcel may be bounded and described, and be any or all of said measurements more or less.

Meaning and intending to convey, and hereby conveying, the same premises conveyed to the Grantors by Texaco Inc. by deed dated March 17, 1964, recorded with said Deeds Book 5171, page 618, and the same is hereby conveyed subject to the restrictions set forth in said deed so far as now in force and applicable, and to 1966 taxes which the Grantees assume and agree to pay.

For the purpose of assuring preservation of the Colonel Appleton House as an historic landmark, and continued maintenance of its exterior and grounds and setting visible from North Main Street or the North Green in a manner conforming to the traditional appearance and historical characteristics of the Green and its surroundings, said Grantees, by joining in this deed COVENANT for themselves, and their
